HEARING OF CITIZENS

Councilwoman Robie reported that property maintenance issues are being worked on.

Councilwoman Robie reported that there are two Stray Cats cases pending.

Councilwoman Robie reported that there are two Pool Water Complaints.

Councilwoman Robie reported that the Child Health Clinic is continuing.

Under Board of Education

Councilwoman Robie advised of some very exciting news. The Board of Education is honored to receive a scholarship from Adele Olejarz who passed away recently. She left a scholarship in the amount of \$8,000,000.00. 100% fully funded 4 years. Trustees of the fund will do the interviews. The Mayor and the Superintendent will attend a meeting with Assemblyman Schaer. The Board of Education is planning on expanding parking spaces. As of now, we have 1033 students in the school district.

Under Access for All

The Access for All is continuing and expanding. Councilwoman Robie is goes to event to explain the program.

COUNCILMAN KHALDOUN ANDROWIS

Councilman Androwis reported that he spoke to the Finance Department and will be meeting with the Borough Clerk about the finances by the end of the year. Money is to be moved into the Capital Improvement.

Councilman Androwis advised that he spoke to the Recreation Department about overlooking their finances.

Councilman Androwis advised that we do not have a lot of money in town for the Properties Capital Improvement Account. We can only hope for a major ratable. The Farmland and Latex need to be developed. The Capital Improvement spent a lot of money. Councilman Androwis explained the Bonding process. Once we are done we will have new equipment.

Councilman Androwis advised that the streets need to be looked at. Councilman Androwis propose to add more money to the Capital Improvement, if needed.

Councilman Androwis advised that he attended the Bag for Hunger program.

Councilman Androwis advised that the Knights of Columbus will be honoring the Shield on Saturday.

Councilman Androwis advised that he visited the Police Department building and it needs help.

Councilman Androwis advised that we used all the funds for fire and EMS. The Mayor suggested working on a five year plan. We need to look at our needs.

MAYOR'S REPORT

The Mayor reported that they are looking at the Senior Bus. They are looking for something bigger to plan for the future. Different organizations can use this.

Under Library

The Mayor reported that 1600 people used the library in August. We had 36 Kids attending the Summer Reading Program (almost 10 books per child). 221 kids attended various programs. The Mayor is very proud of this.

The Mayor complemented two boards, especially Board of Health for the different programs to the people and the Board of Recreation. We have all these new programs for the adults as well as for our youth. The Summer Concert was supported by all donations. Councilman Sinisi's bride to be took the bull by the horns.

The Mayor would like to have a youth advisory board to possibly come up with ideas for all. The Mayor asked the Superintendent to have the art department design a flag for the Borough.

The Mayor would like to appoint a 125th Anniversary Committee to have a celebration.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT

The attorney made a statement that paving a road is not as simple as one may think. Resolution 2016-119 refers to a negotiated settlement for the paving of the various streets (Adamson Street, Orchard Street, and Armm Avenue) will be finished.

The Mayor advised that he has a lot of anonymous letters sent. He has one complaining about illegal housing. He refers them to the Building Department.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wallington previously awarded a contract to John Garcia Construction Company, Inc. for the 2012/2013 Water Main Replacement Program (hereafter "program"); and

WHEREAS, said Program included the installation of new water mains and related work in various streets throughout Wallington including the profiling and resurfacing of those streets; and

WHEREAS, in conjunction with their "Energy Strong" Program, Public Service Gas (hereafter PSE&G) installed new gas mains and services in several of the streets included in the Program and under a Shared Services Agreement with the Borough of Wallington PSE&G undertook the profiling and resurfacing of the majority of the roadways where new water mains were installed; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor has taken the position that it is entitled to renegotiate the unit prices to be paid pursuant to the contract due to a + /-80% reduction in the quantity for those contract items associated with the profiling and resurfacing of those streets; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wallington has received comments from its professionals and finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the Borough of Wallington to resolve this issue in an amicable fashion ,to permit expediting the completion of the said work; and

WHEREAS, Adolfo and Maria Grambone . have filed a tax appeal with respect to the assessed valuation of the real property commonly known as 90 Mercer Street, Block 24, Lot 24, located within the Borough of Wallington; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wallington, County of Bergen, has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the Borough of Wallington to enter into a settlement agreement in full and final settlement of the tax appeal filed by Adolfo and Maria Grambone; and

- 4. For tax year 2016, the original assessment was Land \$157,500.00; Improvements \$388,000.00 for a total assessment of \$545,500.00. The Tax Counsel for the Borough of Wallington is authorized to request a Tax Court Judgment for calendar year 2016 as follows: Land \$157,500.00; Improvements \$292,500.00; for a total of \$450,000.00.
