Karolina Zyla, 26 Armm Ave, Adam Buguski, 30 Armm Ave & P. Szamborski, 4 Armm Ave: Three separate residents raised concerns over the lack of maintenance of the salvage company on Paterson Ave. Specifically, three main concerns: The first are how cars and parts are being stored and how they are creating and eyesore in their back yard, despite investing money into new fencing. The second is the lack of mosquito, insect, and vermin control with tires and parts creating a breeding area and hiding area for pests. The third a complete lack of grounds maintenance: Trees and brushes are over grown on the property. Ultimately, there is an environmental concern over water run off from the property, odors of chemicals, and overgrown trees collapsing.

Mayor Dabal is aware of the situation; She reported to the property and took pictures from the yards of residents who invited the mayor and asked for help of the unsightly stacked cars and

garbage. Alternative are being canvassed as to what the available alternatives are to remediate the issues.

Mike Chirlo, 64 Jordan Ave: Thanked the Mayor and Council for Paving Jordan Ave. A short discussion took place on a change in the ordinance. Borough Administrator provided a short description and what properties would be impacted. Immediately after a short discussion took place on the industrial property behind his residence with EPA permits.

ENGINEERS REPORT

Provided an overview of the Engineers report. Went into great detail on Hathaway Street: Described the standardized process as guided by the Mayor and Council is to video the sewer pipes prior to paving so there is no non-value-added rework and waste. During this process prior to paving Hathaway it was identified that the main sewer pipe is severely compromised and needs to be replaced. Mr. Juzmeski pointed out that this loss of integrity can be seen on Hathaway as the settling of the ground is visible on the street. The depth of the pipe will create added complexity.

Mayor Dabal advised that this was discussed a long time ago and it was never taken care of; ten years ago, this was a problem. The borough engineer concurred and advised that the pipe could have been relined at a fraction of the cost with longitudinal cracks, but this is not currently an option due to the severe loss of structural integrity. A discussion ensured on various scenarios with the risk of complete pipe collapse.

A short discussion took place on the status of paving streets and the replacement of a water main. An open issue on Union Boulevard and Hathaway with regard to a tripping hazard is being looked at. A discussion took place between the borough engineer, borough attorney, and borough engineer on the firehouse roofs. The mayor asked about the status of the garbage specifications for the new garbage bid, and the lack of proper standards and penalties in the old one.

Marc Liebman ESQ, Represents Umdash USA LTD: Advised that this ordinance was challenged and invalidated; Likewise, the passage of this ordinance will again be challenged and be invalidated. There is a pending civil rights claim on the borough and, this ordinance can be described as defacto spot zoning. All of this litigation can be resolved. The passing of this ordinance will only drive up your legal expenses.

Mike Chirlo, 64 Jordan Ave: Described a commercial property in the borough that is creating dust and residue with multiple trucks creating traffic. Doesn't understand how a property can be remediated when soil gets hauled around and mixed around. Mr. Chirlo described various environmental issues on various properties that will be remediated by the ordinance change. Ordinances need to be in place to protect residences and the council should protect us. Businesses that disrupt our lives need to be held accountable. Thanked the Mayor and Council for passing the ordinance.

OLD BUSINESS

Mayor Dabal asked about the town wide garage sale and shredding event: Town Wide Garage Sale and shredding is set for September 26 with a rain date of September 27. Borough administrator advised that the DPW superintendent has requested Alternate side to start up again; The date of September 28 was directed as the reinstatement. Parks will start being opened up by the end of this week.

Numerous complaints are coming in for 17 Strong Street: Borough Administrator stated in effect that summonses have been issued.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Dabal: There is a need for a Wallington Facebook page. Advised that there is a lot of false and misleading information. This way if there are any questions residents can come to our official Facebook Page.

Borough Administrator provided a summary of known statistics on COVID infections in the borough of Wallington. At this juncture, depending what report you are looking at, we have 9 active cases. Mr. Olmo also spoke about executive order 103 & 104 and changes made to the civic center for the senior center. No clear direction has been provided when the center will re-open.

Councilwoman Ivanicki asked questions regarding an electrical panel at the 201 firehouse. Borough Administrator described the situation, and it appears there is an underlining problem that needs to be identified.

Borough Attorney, Richard Malagiere, requested the Mayor and Council to authorize him to claim the performance bond.
