Other challenges include stagnant state aid. There should be an increase in ratables that will offset the tax impact in the future. Provided a detailed chart pointing out that approximately 60% of tax dollars go to schools. Considering various factors in the economy and inflation out of the control the Governing Body considers the increase very reasonable with only a \$79 municipal increase to the average assessed home.

ENGINEERS REPORT

Provided a summarized overview of all the newly paved roads; Provide an update on roads in the pipeline to be paved into the future. Provided a summary of curbing and legal requirements. Drainage improvements to be implemented in the area of Parkview and Maple. A discussion took place on stormwater piping and catch basin coverings that will prevent garbage and debris into the system. Mayor Dabal described multiple areas where collapsed pipes were discovered as a result of poor infrastructure management in the past. A discussion took place on the new Library, building up the elevation, nuclear gauge testing, and progress of construction. Embankment stabilization process with DEP and FEMA is a long process. Multiple wooden beams on the roof of the police building needs to be replaced; Many of the old roof support beams were found to be rotted and in need of replacement in the Police building. A discussion took place on various water mitigation issues. The updated and improved Tax Maps are about 25% completed. A discussion took place on sidewalk and grade project. Engineer described engineering regarding the addition of new poles for Christmas decorations and how they need to withstand wind loads. Mayor advised that she is concerned over the poor look of the Gregory avenue bridge; It looks terrible with rust and graffiti.
