COMMITTEE REPORTS

COUNCILMAN EUGENIUSZ RACHELSKI

Spoke about re-evaluation and does not think it's a good time to do one. Conversations with DOKA are moving forward.

COUNCILWOMAN WENDYSU IVANICKI

Councilwoman read out a report from Fire Chief Sinisi. Described various issues concerning damage from Hurricane IDA. Advised that its time to replace the 2008 Suburban. Spoke about increasing uniform allowance by \$50.

COUNCILWOMAN SUSANNE PREINFALK

Provided overview of COVID cases in the school system. Advised that there is an increase in dog bites and many of them are not licensed. In next phase of the Library Construction with pre-demo. Holiday festival was an enormous success; Thanked DPW and Ray Dynes with all the work that was done.

COUNCILMAN KHALDOUN ANDROWIS

No major claims have been submitted by the Borough. Three lights were entered into the system for this month. There are a couple shortages with water meters. A discussion took place on hiring new DPW workers.

COUNCILMAN TOMASZ SADECKI

Provided an update on the Shade Tree along with a summary of resignations; They met public criteria for quorum at latest meeting.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Reviewed meeting with command staff from Police. Topics include, police building and decision being made at the Mayor and Council. Status of promoted officers and dispatching. Discussion took place on licensing of dogs and increase in dog bites. Multiple arrests have taken place as a result of the addition of cameras that were placed in the area of bridges. A brief discussion took place on bail reform and issues with perpetrators laughing at justice system while being processed. Chief is asking for additional cameras and technology.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Provided a over view of Pistol Range Contract, Cell Tower Issue, Study of the replacement is in its infancy, EMS medical director, few issues concerning master plan and commercial truck parking. Hurricane IDA issues regarding emergency expenses. Started on dog license enforcement review and will have insight out by end of day tomorrow. No significant updates on outstanding litigation; No issue is substantial for need of closed session. Mayor Dabal provided back ground with parking issues on streets adjacent to apartment buildings and would like to move forward to help residents.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wallington, County of Bergen, has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the Borough of Wallington to enter into a settlement agreement and stipulation of settlement in full and final settlement of the tax appeal filed by the Taxpayer; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council has received the advice of its Special Tax Counsel with respect to this tax appeal. The Special Tax Counsel for the Borough of Wallington has represented that he has made such examination of the value and proper assessment of the property and has

obtained such appraisals, analysis, and/or information with respect to the valuation and assessment of the property as he deemed necessary and appropriate for the purpose of enabling him to enter into this Settlement Agreement and Stipulation of Settlement and to fairly advise the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wallington of the consequences of the settlement and the possible outcomes if the appeal proceeded to trial. The Special Tax Counsel for the Borough of Wallington also represented that he consulted with the assessor of the Borough of Wallington and that he has concurred with the settlement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wallington does hereby make the following findings:

- a) that it is in the best interest of the Borough of Wallington to reach an economic and businesslike resolution of the tax appeal for calendar years 2020 and 2021 filed by the Taxpayer with respect to the real property located at 181 Paterson Avenue, Block 41, Lot 16, Wallington, New Jersey;
- b) that the proposed settlement will result in an assessment at the fair assessable value of the property consistent with assessing practices generally applicable in the taxing district as required by law;
- c) the terms of the tax appeal filed by the Taxpayer that the Mayor and Council is authorizing its counsel to settle are as follows:
 1. For tax year 2020, the original assessment was Land - \$233,500.00; Improvements - \$866,500.00 for a total assessment of \$1,100,000.00. The Tax Counsel for the Borough of Wallington is authorized to request a Tax Court Judgment for calendar year 2020 as follows: Land - \$233,500.00; Improvements \$866,500.00; for a total of \$1,100,000.00
 2. For tax year 2021, the original assessment was Land - \$233,500.00; Improvements - \$866,500.00 for a total assessment of \$1,100,000.00. The Tax Counsel for the Borough of Wallington is authorized to request a Tax Court Judgment for calendar year 2021 as follows: Land - \$233,500.00; Improvements \$601,500.00; for a total of \$835,000.00
 3. The assessment for calendar year 2022 shall be adjusted by the tax assessor for the Borough of Wallington as follows: Land - \$233,500.00; Improvements - \$416,500.00 for a total assessment of \$650,000.00, with the express condition that the Taxpayer shall not have the right to seek any further reduction in the assessment for tax year 2022.

- d) Statutory interest, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:3-27.2, having been waived by taxpayer, shall not be paid provided the tax refund is paid within 60 days of the date of entry of the Tax Court judgment.
- e) Paul M. Elias, Esq. is hereby directed to enter into the Settlement Agreement and Stipulation of Settlement which he reviewed with the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wallington pertaining to this matter and that he causes the same to be filed with the Tax Court of New Jersey.

TITLE: RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH OF WALLINGTON THROUGH THE WALLINGTON POLICE DEPT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE DEFENSE LOGISTICS AGENCY, LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPPORT OFFICE, 1033 PROGRAM TO ENABLE THE WALLINGTON POLICE TO REQUEST AND ACQUIRE EXCESS DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE EQUIPMENT

WHEREAS, the United States Congress authorized the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) 1033 Program to make use of excess Department of Defense personal property by making that personal property available to municipal, county and State law enforcement agencies (LEAs); and

WHEREAS, DLA rules mandate that all equipment acquired through the 1033 Program remain under the control of the requesting LEA; and

WHEREAS, participation in the 1033 Program allows municipal and county LEAs to obtain property they might not otherwise be able to afford in order to enhance community preparedness, response, and resiliency; and

WHEREAS, although property is provided through the 1033 Program at no cost to municipal and county LEAs, these entities are responsible for the costs associated with delivery, maintenance, fueling, and upkeep of the property, and for specialized training on the operation of any acquired property; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-30.2 requires that the governing body of the municipality or county approve, by a majority of the full membership, both enrollment in, and the acquisition of any property through, the 1033 Program; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wallington that the Wallington Police Department is hereby authorized to enroll in the 1033 Program for no more than a one-year period, with authorization to participate terminating on December 31 of the current calendar year from January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Wallington Police Department is hereby authorized to acquire items of non-controlled property designated “DEMIL A,” which may include office supplies, office furniture, computers, electronic equipment, generators, field packs, non-military vehicles, clothing, traffic and transit signal systems, exercise equipment, farming and moving equipment, storage devices and containers, tools, medical and first aid equipment and supplies, personal protection equipment and supplies, construction materials, lighting supplies, beds and sleeping mats, wet and cold weather equipment and supplies, respirators, binoculars, and any other supplies or equipment of a non-military nature identified by the LEA, if it shall become available in the period of time for which this resolution authorizes, based on the needs of the Wallington Police Department, without restriction; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Wallington Police Department is hereby authorized to acquire the following “DEMIL B through Q” property, if it shall become available in the period of time for which this resolution authorizes; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the “DEMIL B through Q” controlled 3-page property list in its entirety is hereby approved and hereto attached to this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Carmelo Imbruglia and the Wallington Police Department shall develop and implement a full training plan and policy for the maintenance and use of the acquired property; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Carmelo Imbruglia and the Wallington Police Department shall provide a quarterly accounting of all property obtained through the 1033 Program which shall be available to the public upon request; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect immediately and shall be valid to authorize requests to acquire “DEMIL A” property and “DEMIL B through Q” property that may be made available through the 1033 Program during the period of time for which this resolution authorizes; with Program participation and all property request authorization terminating on December 31st of the current calendar year from January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022.
